Qualifying Programmes:

The W&RSETA will consider applications for degrees and diplomas that address the above priority skills for the sector at NQF levels 5 - 8. TVET institutions may apply for NCV Levels 2 - 4 and Nated N4 - N6 qualifications in relation to the above occupations.

Qualifying Institutions:

- The following Institutions are invited to apply for bursary funding:
 - Public HETs and TVETCs
 - Private HETs and TVET colleges
 - Bursary service providers / Bursary administrators

Application Process:

- Applications are to be made using the attached Bursary Application Form
- A comprehensive Costing Schedule must accompany the application.
- All application forms must be submitted to the Regional Office by 31 August 2020.
- Stakeholders are reminded that the W&RSETA will not fund post graduate programmes for the 2020/2021 financial period as a result of the SDL payment holiday announced in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Submission Requirements:

- Institutions must submit the following documentation with their application as proof of registration and programme accreditation:
 - SAQA registration number for the programme/qualification
 - Proof of CHE registration (approved letter from the CHE)
 - Proof of DHET registration (DHET certificate)
- Successful institutions will enter into an agreement with the W&RSETA for the duration of the study period of the funded students.
- Institutions must provide the W&RSETA with the following documents upon successful conclusion of an MOU to award the bursary funding:
 - List of selected students
 - Cost schedule per course and per student
 - Proof of registration at the institution
 - Bursary Agreement (signed between student and the W&RSETA)
 - Certified copies of identity documents of the students (not older than 6 months)
- Institutions will be responsible for the recruitment and registration of qualifying students.

Bursary Beneficiaries:

- South African citizens (below 35 years)
- Accepted or registered with the institution in relation to the fields listed above

Funding Structure:

- Tuition fees: Full fees as prescribed by the institution
- Accommodation: Must be a recognised residence and rates capped as prescribed by the institution
- Book Allowance: Cost of books as recommended by the institution
Include stationery, printing, data and electronic devices as prescribed by the institution
- Meals: Capped at R18 000 per annum and will be paid to the institution
- Transport: To be determined by the institution
