		Recruitment and Selection of delegates
		Admit and register delegates on the NQF levels 6-7 SAQA registered QCTO/CHE accredited qualifications.
		 Design a customised retail management development qualification suitable for the Wholesale and Retail Sector with detailed timelines and a calendar for the duration of the programme.
		Deliver the programme and provide academic support for the duration of the programme.
		 Coordinate and deliver the training programme through a hybrid model (online and physical classes) and provide the delegates with all study materials, laptops/tablets, accommodation and transport for physical block classes.
		Design and coordinate customised local immersions to expose delegates to wholesale and retail best practices.
		Develop a communication plan on processes, requirements and expectations from registration throughout the programme including stakeholder briefings and quarterly feedback sessions.
		 Engage in alignment processes with other institutions appointed to deliver the programme to ensure standardisation and efficient communication and stakeholder management.
		 Issue SAQA registered QCTO/CHE accredited qualifications to delegates who successfully complete the programme.
		EXPECTED OUTCOMES AND DELIVERABLES
		The training provider will be required to:
		Sign a memorandum of agreement/contract with the W&RSETA prior to implementation of the programme.
		 Customise an accredited qualification to deliver a Retail Management Development Programme incorporating sector experts and/or leaders and facilitate relevant local immersions.
		 Provide an implementation plan for the duration of the programme including delegate support, detailed calendar, communication and programme overview in- cluding the core modules and electives (where applica- ble).
		 Register the allocated number of delegates from the Wholesale and Retail Sector on an NQF level 6/7 SAQA accredited qualification.

		Issue a SAQA registered NQF level 6/7 qualification to delegates who complete the programme.
		Facilitate a graduation ceremony in conjunction with the W&RSETA and other appointed institutions to streamline the process.
		Submit closure reports at the conclusion of the programme.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- The training provider must have a valid SAQA accreditation/registration and be registered with the Department of Higher Education and Training.
- The training provider must be in good standing with SARS.
- Applications must be made by completing the <u>PIVOTAL DG25/26 Funding Window Application Form</u> (available from the W&RSETA website).
- Applicants should submit the application form with relevant supporting documents.
- Applicants must submit a detailed implementation plan, including the profiles and experience of the faculty that will be appointed for the programme.
- All delegates must be registered on the W&RSETA Learner Management Information System (LMS) by no later than 31 January 2026.
- Track record with client reference letters on the Client's letterhead on successful implementation of management development programmes must be demonstrated.
- Experience in delivering management development programmes in the Wholesale and Retail Sector will be an added advantage.
- The appointed institutions will be required to engage and collaborate to ensure standardisation of project implementation.
- Failure to meet deliverables within the stipulated timeliness will result in the withdrawal of the allocation and funding will be re-allocated to an institution that is able to meet the timelines.
- The budget allocation will be made in line with the W&RSETA funding model.

Applications must be submitted to RMDP@wrseta.org.za by 25 July 2025. No late applications will be considered.
