W&RSETA CELEBRATES 20-YEAR MILESTONE WITH AN UNQUALIFIED AUDIT REPORT FROM AGSA



he Wholesale and Retail SETA (W&RSETA) presented its 2019/20 Annual Report to stakeholders at the 2020 Annual General Meeting on 24 November 2020. Marking 20 years of existence as the skills development authority in the Wholesale and Retail Sector. The W&RSETA announced an unqualified audit report from the Auditor-General South Africa (AGSA) with 67% performance against the Annual Performance Plan.

W&RSETA PROGRAMMES TO ASSIST WHOLESALE AND RETAIL COMPANIES DURING COVID-19 PANDEMIC

The W&RSETA is implementing the following support programmes/measures for the Wholesale and Retail Sector through a revised Annual Performance Plan to focus on job retention by reskilling and multiskilling and entrepreneurship:

- More than R12 million for Personal Protective Equipment and data grants to support over 12 000 unemployed W&RSETA funded learners.
- R45 million Zivikele COVID-19 project is funding the training of 600 TVET and HET graduates in a 12-month workplace programme who will be placed in wholesale and retail companies to assist with COVID-19 management.
- R21 million to support 1 700 bursary holders at public institutions with laptop devices.
