The W&RSETA hereby invites all registered small and micro companies, informal traders, co-operatives, NPO/NGO/CBOs and entrepreneurs operating in the Wholesale and Retail Sector to participate in the 2022/23 Discretionary Grant funding opportunity. Stakeholders can select training interventions either on credit or non-credit bearing programmes and provision must be made for Personal Protective Equipment to ensure precautionary measures for learners and facilitators during the training sessions. All W&RSETA-accredited training providers and providers with W&RSETA scope may apply for this funding window. The interventions available for funding per stakeholder category are listed below.
