- Entrepreneurship development for youthowned businesses

# How can SMMEs benefit from the W&RSETA programmes?

Companies with an annual salary bill of R500 000 and above must complete a workplace skills plan to indicate their training needs each year by 30 April. The SETA assists companies to submit this document at no cost.
