- The delegates are in possession of an NQF Level 7 from Regenesys Business Schools in South Africa and have attended the international component of the programme.
- The successful training provider/business school/university must be able to register the 23 learners/
- delegates into NQF Level 8 with their current NQF Level 7.
 Applications must be made by completing the PIVOTAL DG20/21 Funding Window Application
- Applicant must submit a Training Rollout Plan and detailed Implementation Plan
- All learners must be captured on the Learner Benefit Template by no later than 15 March 2021, and Learners Agreements, signed by all parties, must be submitted to ILDP@wrseta.org.za by 25 March 2021.
- All delegates must be registered with the institution by 23 March 2021.
- The training provider must have a valid SAQA accreditation/registration and registered with the Department of Higher Education and Training.
- The training provider must be in good standing with SARS.
- Stakeholder track record on successful implementation NQF Level 8
- The provider must create file for all completed attendance registers and completed agreements as well as valid certified ID copies/driver's license for all learners for submission to the W&RSETA.
- Failure to meet deliverables stipulated within the provided timelines will result in the withdrawal of the allocation and funding re-allocated to an institution that is able to meet the timelines.
