TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- Skills development providers and worker colleges specializing in delivering training for trade union members are eligible to apply for this grant. The applicants must demonstrate a track record in providing training for trade unions within the Wholesale and Retail environment.
- Affiliation and/or agreements with trade unions will be an added advantage.
- Applications must be made by completing the **Non-PIVOTAL DG21/22 Funding Window Application Form**.
- Applications must submit a business proposal and implementation plan.
- Applications must be submitted to the W&RSETA at <u>TradeUnionProjects@wrseta.org.za</u> by 22 February 2022. No late applications will be considered.
- All learners must be captured on the Learner Benefit Template no later than 20 March 2022. Learner agreements, signed by all parties, must be submitted to the W&RSETA by no later than 25 March 2022.
- Training provider must have valid SETA accreditation by one (1) of the 21 SETAs.
- Training provider must be in good standing with SARS.
- Training of workers must be completed by 27 March 2022. The programme will be delivered as a one-day training and can be offered online, blended, or contact.
- Training provider must ensure that all learners complete attendance registers and submit valid certified ID copies
- Failure to deliver the training within the stipulated timelines will result in the withdrawal of the allocation and funding reallocated to providers that are able to meet the timelines.
- Stakeholder track record on successful implementation of W&RSETA trade union training projects will be considered or added advantage.
- Training provider must ensure that prevailing COVID-19 regulations are adhered to during the training.
