







he informal sector is a significant part of the South African economy creating much-needed jobs to address high unemployment and poverty.

The W&RSETA continues to implement innovative initiatives to support the growth of the SMME sector, and its latest groundbreaking innovation is an in-market business development and capacitation programme in partnership with Kenyan Zetech University and Wits University. In 2023, the W&RSETA launched the Informal Traders Exchange Programme with 117 informal traders and exposed them to Nairobi's thriving informal trade focused on technological and innovation best practices.

One of the main components of the programme was the immersion in Nairobi, in collaboration with the Kenya National Chamber of Commerce where informal traders were exposed to informal businesses, comprising visits to selected businesses for practical experiential learning in the areas of business automation, innovation, and marketing. The immersion was followed by a six-month mentorship programme.
