Challenges in External Operating Environment



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Misalignment of the Government FY in line with W&R Sector's financial and operational calendar = **low annual take up**

Company applications for the Mandatory and Discretionary Grants not aligned to the Annual Performance Plan = under and over subscriptions in terms of Annexure II applications

Influence of Training Providers on companies on programmes to apply for = **skewed skills supply and demand in the Sector**

Slow pipeline development of BBBEE training providers, moderators and assessors to be able to service the W&R sector= **monopoly in the sector**

Recent contraction of economy 0,7% affecting W&R Sector = reduced revenue in terms levies collected

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Challenges in the Internal Operating Environment



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Ageing IT systems that do not have capacity to support current operations = **operational inefficiencies** - **process of integration of all systems in progress**

Manual business processes = operational inefficiencies –integration process of all systems in progress

Organisational structure not aligned to current strategy = skills mismatch – new organisational structure developed to address mismatch to be approved and implemented

Misalignment of SETA's planning system e.g. project management cycle to organisational planning cycle= late project approvals and contracting, delays in training – new delivery model to address challenge

Silos within departments = processes not integrated and duplication of effort – new delivery model to address challenge

Regional growth in participating companies and SETA programmes which are not supported by current structure and systems = **operational inefficiencies** - **new delivery model to address challenge**

Inadequate monitoring and evaluation systems – new delivery model to address challenge

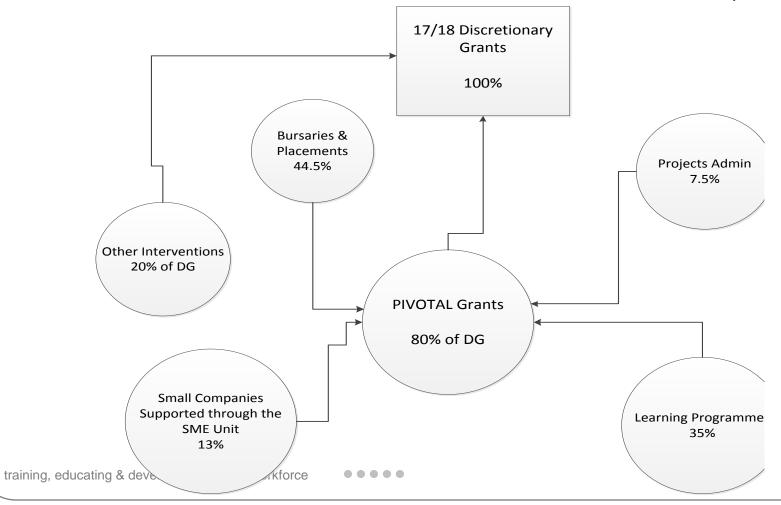

- Training conducted after contract expired; and
- Training on interventions not contracted for
